This year November 11th falls on the Friday before SRD's reunion. UT has scheduled a torchlight parade & rally beginning in front of Kinsolving, south on Guadalupe, east on 21st Street to Gregory Gym. The event will feature "then and now" segments and the tower will be lit orange with a 50 in the windows.

MEMORIES-Charlton Heston Visits, Betty Jordan Boynton '55

It was fall of 1955, my freshman year at UT and SRD. To be exact, it was Texas-OU weekend. Back then, we had strict rules regarding hours to be in; permission from parents was required for weekends away. My friend, Joan Jordan, and I, Betty Jordan, did not have permission to go to Dallas and felt a little out of sorts to be stuck in Austin when all the fun seemed to be in Dallas.

We happened to note that Charlton Heston was coming to the Paramount Theater in Austin for the world premiere of the movie, *Lucy Gallant*. We thought our weekend could be salvaged if we could get Mr. Heston to be our guest at SRD for dinner. Friday afternoon, we called the theater and a few phone calls later reached his manager. He said if we would call back Monday at 11 a.m., he would let us know for certain if they could come for dinner Monday night.

We did not tell a soul what we had done because if this little project failed, it would forever be a secret between Joan and me. Since I had an eleven o'clock class, Joan made the call to Mr. Heston's manager and was told that he, Mr. Heston, and I believe one more guest from the Paramount staff would be glad to be our guests that evening. I arrived at the dorm shortly after 12, and now we were panicked. We figured we better tell the dorm mother first what we had done.

Her first reaction was, "Oh my goodness; all the tablecloths (we always had white linen tablecloths on Sundays) are in the laundry." We assured her that was not a problem; we had not promised tablecloths. Next, she began to talk about how we would put him at the head table and who would get to sit there. We said, "Oops, he and his entourage are our guests; we are paying for their meals, and we want them to sit at our table with our friends." She agreed and that afternoon we invited the lucky people who would join us.

Shortly before dinner, we went to the front lawn to await our hero, and still a little nervous that he might not actually show up. Right on the dot, six o'clock, he and his entourage arrived. Meantime, they had all the SRD residents standing at dinner waiting for a bit longer than usual. They had no clue what was happening.

After the introductions on the front lawn, we made our way to the dining room. Our regular table was at the east end of the room, so we, of course, made our grand entrance at the west end so we could show our prize to the entire room. As we entered, we could hear the murmurs, "It's Charlton Heston; no, it can't be; yes, it is!"

We had a most delightful time with Mr. Heston. He was especially impressed with our waiter and told us all about how he had waited tables while attending Northwestern University. He answered the many curious questions about this person and that person in Hollywood. All in all, he was a delightful guest. I don't know what his take on the evening was, but I do know that he absolutely made the entire fall semester a success for two young freshmen!

Jeane House Hughes '53-'54 "Oh, how times have changed. It was 1953 and I was a resident at SRD. There was a Friday night curfew with the doors being locked at 11:00 p.m. I came running up the sidewalk and landed on the porch at 11:00. The housemother saw me but closed the door as I approached. I was there but not inside. I did finally get in. I was not tardy again."
